## HUMAN TRAFFICKING DEFINED

According to the US Department of Justice, human trafficking is a crime that involves compelling or coercing a person to provide labor or services, or to engage in commercial sex acts. The coercion can be subtle or overt, physical or psychological.

## WHAT TO WATCH OUT FOR



### CONTROL & COERCION

No ID, Money, or Phone  
Monitored, escorted, or followed closely



### BEHAVIORAL RED FLAGS

Fearful or withdrawn  
No eye contact



### TRAVEL-RELATED RED FLAGS

Few belongings  
Unsure where going, staying, or is going to meet them



### WORK-RELATED RED FLAGS

No contract  
Unsafe conditions
